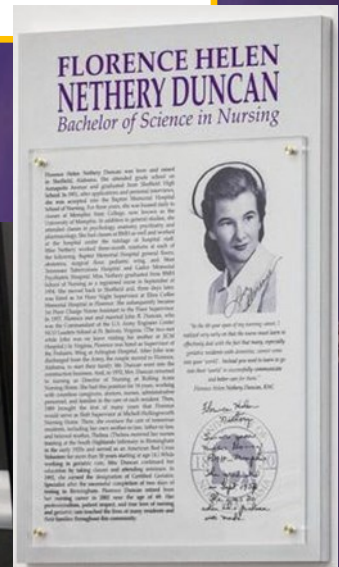
"This generous gift will make a meaningful impact on the lives of our students for many years to come." The people she served and cared for were right here in this community, and that's what makes this gift so special."

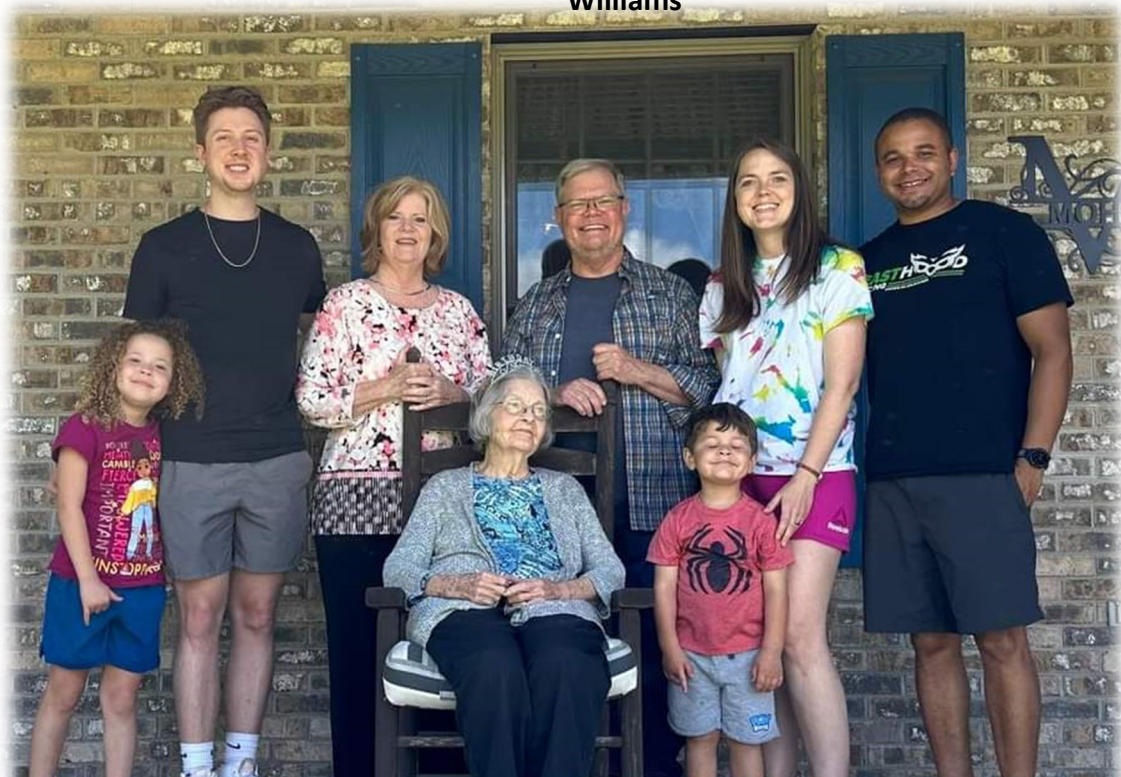

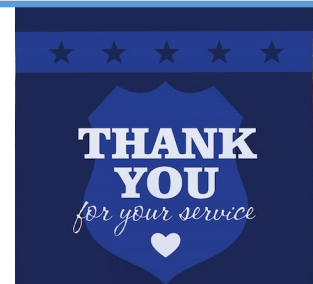

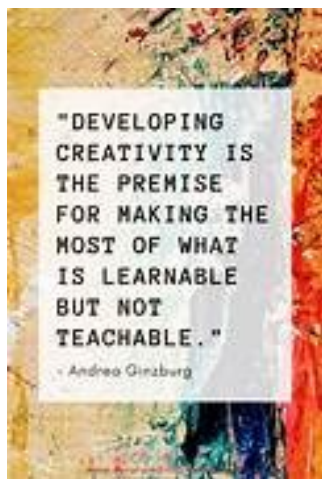
